THE PARISH REGISTERS

The Parish Registers hold wonderful depth of information for the Wilberforce area and the families who have their lives documented through baptisms, weddings and burials. Many Wilberforce pioneer names appear frequently throughout.

The Registers begin in 1826, prior to that these life events were recorded in the Windsor Registers.

The first Registers at St. John's containing baptisms, marriages and burials were rebound in 1964 as a gift of Dennis Bruce Gosper in memory of his ancestors.

At the Bicentennial weekend, we intend to have an original register on display, as well as copies of all pages for families to find their relatives and research their family history.

The early volumes are now held at the Anglican Diocese archives where thev are appropriately preserved for future generations. They are also view available to microfilm at Hawkesbury Library.



HOWARTH TOMBSTONE

This headstone that stands next to the Schoolhouse is for a young man named John Howorth. He died by a snake bite on his family property on the Hawkesbury River. A newspaper article in *The Sydney Gazette and New South Wales Advertiser* details the events of October 1804 and can be found on Trove. The headstone was maintained until 1960 where it was restored and moved onto the Church property by the Hawkesbury Historical Society.



WILL THE BICENTENNIAL GO AHEAD?

SCHOOLMASTER SPOTLIGHT - SAMUEL RUSSELL (1874-1877)

Samuel Russell was born in Kent, England in 1838. He came to Australia in the late 1850's. He met and married Ellen Newton in 1859 in the gold mining town of Tambaroora. They had 9 children as they travelled around New South Wales for his teaching appointments. He taught at Wilberforce for only 3 years before moving on to Windsor. He lived out his days in Bowral and upon his death in 1907, his obituary espoused him as a beloved educator with high moral character.
